ORDINANCE 2018-05

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 9.04 – SMOKING IN PUBLIC PLACES – TO INCLUDE ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICES

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2008, the Common Council adopted Ordinance 2008-04 which prohibited smoking in certain public places;

WHEREAS, in recent years the use of electronic smoking devices has increased;

WHEREAS, prohibiting the use of electronic smoking devices in public places where smoking is prohibited benefits the citizens of the City of Lafayette by minimizing the unknown health risks to users and bystanders;

WHEREAS, the use of electronic smoking devices in areas where smoking is prohibited creates confusion and concern and can interfere with the enforcement of existing smoke-free laws;

WHEREAS, many public health professionals are concerned that permitting electronic smoking devices to be used in smoke free areas renormalizes smoking-like behavior which may result in higher youth initiation rates and a slower decline in adult cessation rates;

WHEREAS, across Indiana – including Indianapolis, Franklin, Greenwood, Kokomo, Bloomington and Howard County – have included electronic smoking devices in their smoke free ordinances;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAFAYETTE as follows:

1. Section 9.04.010 of the City of Lafayette Municipal Code is hereby amended to include the following definition:

"Electronic Smoking Device" means any electronic product that can be used to aerosolize or vaporize and deliver nicotine or other substances to the person inhaling from the device. The term includes any such device, whether manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe or under any other product name or descriptor and any cartridge or other component of the device or related product.

2. Section 9.04.010 of the City of Lafayette Municipal Code is hereby amended to amend the definition of "Smoking" and as amended shall read as follows:

"Smoking" means the act of puffing, having in one's possession, holding or carrying a lighted or smoldering cigar, cigarette, pipe or smoking equipment of any kind, or lighting a cigar, cigarette, pipe or smoking equipment of any kind. "Smoking" also includes the use of an Electronic Smoking Device in any manner or in any form.

ORDINANCE 2018-06

An Ordinance to Amend Ordinance 2017-37

An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries of the Appointed Officers and Employees
Of the City of Lafayette, Indiana, for the Year 2018,
Excluding the Sworn Protective Occupation and Law Enforcement Members of
The Police and Fire Departments

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Lafayette, Indiana adopted Ordinance 2017-37, An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries of the Appointed Officers and Employees of the City of Lafayette, Indiana for the Year 2018, Excluding Sworn Protective Occupation and Law Enforcement Members of the Police and Fire Departments; and

WHEREAS, there are two (2) Truck Driver/Collector (LTC IV) positions and two (2) Truck Driver (LTC III) positions within the Sanitation Department that had been approved and included in the 2018 budget, however, the positions were inadvertently omitted from the salary ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Mayor has determined the needs of the City would be best served by adding a Downtown Security Officer (PAT I) to City staff in lieu of employing a downtown security officer through a third party;

WHEREAS, the Mayor has consented to the additional positions; and

WHEREAS, the changes above enhances and provides efficiency to the City of Lafayette;

NOW THEREFORE, Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the City of Lafayette, Indiana:

Ordinance 2017-37, An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries of the Appointed Officers and Employees of the City of Lafayette, Indiana for the Year 2018, Excluding Sworn Protective Occupation and Law Enforcement Members of the Police and Fire Departments, is hereby amended as follows:

- 1. Adding two (2) Truck Drivers/Collectors (LTC IV) to the Sanitation Department bringing the total number of Truck Drivers/Collectors (LTC IV) to twenty (20);
- 2. Adding two (2) Truck Drivers (LTC III) to the Sanitation Department bringing the total number of Truck Drivers (LTC III) to six (6);
- 3. Adding a Downtown Security Officer (PAT I) to the Traffic Department.

All other terms and provisions of Ordinance 2017-37, An Ordinance Fixing the Salaries of the Appointed Officers and Employees of the City of Lafayette, Indiana for the Year 2018, Excluding Sworn Protective Occupation and Law Enforcement Members of the Police and Fire Departments shall remain in full force and effect.
