Mayor Roswarski to Declare Snow Emergency for City of Lafayette

LAFAYETTE, INDIANA – February 14, 2021 – This evening, Mayor Tony Roswarski announced that he will declare a **Snow Emergency** for the City of Lafayette effective at 8:00 pm today.

“We have the possibility of experiencing a significant amount of snow over the next 24 hours,” said Mayor Roswarski. “Citizens are asked to remove their vehicles from the city streets to assist our snowplowing efforts throughout the community. High winds, blowing snow and bitter temperatures all reduce the effectiveness of salt, requiring crews to make more passes to clear the streets.”

During a Snow Emergency, residents are required to move their vehicles from marked Snow Emergency Routes within 12 hours of a Snow Emergency declaration. Failure to remove vehicles by 8:00 am tomorrow morning, Monday, February 15, may result in fines and towing. However, the City is also asking that residents and businesses move vehicles off all streets throughout the city as much as possible to assist in snow removal. Residents are encouraged to share their driveways and parking lots to facilitate this cleanup. Homeowners can assist storm recovery by shoveling their sidewalks, clearing snow around fire hydrants and calling 911 only in the event of an emergency.



“It is important that we work together to ensure city streets are cleared as quickly and efficiently as possible,” said Mayor Roswarski. “Residents are also encouraged to review their own emergency preparedness plans and review the Snow Emergency Routes at <http://lafayette.in.gov/341/Snow-Removal>.”

While no snow event is exactly the same, it generally takes 10-12 hours after the snowfall ceases for crews to plow and salt priority streets such as main thoroughfares. Residential streets may take up to 48 hours to plow. Three city departments will have crews working around the clock to address the situation.

For the latest updates about the storm, residents are asked to check local television and radio stations and sign up for free public safety text alerts from Everbridge.com by texting their ZIP code to 888777.

As a reminder, Lafayette City Hall will be closed on Monday, February 15 in celebration of President's Day. Due to the severity of this storm, please check local television and radio stations to see if Lafayette City Hall will be open for normal business hours on Tuesday, February 16.
